

Dear Friends,

On this Thursday, August 10th, the Church celebrates the feast of Saint Lawrence. Saint Lawrence was ordained as a deacon by Pope Sixtus II in the year of our Lord 257. He served the Church of Rome and was renowned for outreach to the poor. Unfortunately these were difficult times for the nascent Christian community. The Roman Emperor Valerian had issued an edict that all bishops, priests and deacons were to be put to death and the goods of the Church confiscated. Pope Sixtus II was captured and executed on August 6, 258. Lawrence, holding the Churches treasury, immediately distributed all of the funds to the poor before they could be seized by the Emperor. He was taken into custody and put to death on August 10, 258.

Saint Lawrence inspires us to dedicate ourselves in Christ to service of others. He reminds us of the need to be ever mindful of the poor. His final heroic witness, in martyrdom, holds before us the Christian's true home in the Kingdom of God. Let us pray for all who suffer persecution in holding fast to the call of Christ. The following prayer comes from the Knights of Columbus:

O God of all the nations, the One God who is and was
and always will be,

in your providence you willed that your Church be
united to the suffering of your Son.

Look with mercy on your servants who are perse-
cuted for their faith in you.

Grant them perseverance and courage to be worthy
imitators of Christ.

Bring your wisdom upon leaders of nations to work
for peace among all peoples.

May your Spirit open conversion for those who con-
tradict your will, that we may live in harmony.

Give us the grace to be united in truth and freedom,
and to always seek your will in our lives.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.



AUGUST 13 READINGS

First Reading — Elijah waits on the mountain for the LORD to pass by (1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a).
Psalm — Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation (Psalm 85).
Second Reading — From the Israelites, with their law and the prophets, comes the Christ (Romans 9:1-5).
Gospel — As Jesus walked on the sea, the disciples were terrified (Matthew 14:22-33).

These readings are listed and briefly described so that we might start to reflect on them before we gather for Sunday Mass each week.

EYEWITNESSES

Today, the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord, is a day of eyewitness accounts. The first, a vision reported by the prophet Daniel, was well known to Jesus and his apostles. The vision account was written in quite mystical and figurative language. It is a vision of heaven, powerful and memorable. There are flames of fire, burning wheels, the Ancient One, and a Son of Man. Clearly, Daniel saw something. But was it a dream? Was it real? Was it merely a clever myth?

Peter wants no such confusion about his vision! We are told in Matthew's Gospel what he and his friends James and John saw when they went up on the mountain with Jesus one day. Jesus warned the three witnesses to tell no one until "the Son of Man has been raised from the dead" (Matthew 17:9). Lest readers of one of the Gospels discount the story or simply write it off as a pious myth, Peter gives his own account of the Transfiguration of Jesus in his second letter to the church. He writes with authority, as an eyewitness.

The Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord

Today we celebrate the day when Peter, James and John were given the chance to see Jesus how he really is—as God the Son!

The four of them climbed to the top of the mountain. When they reached the top, Jesus' appearance changed. His face was shining, as brightly as the sun, and his clothing also became a bright white. Then two people from the Old Testament, who had died long ago, appeared and talked to Jesus! One was Moses, the person whom had received God's Law in the form of the Ten Commandments, and Elijah, the prophet who continuously told people to turn away from sin, and obey God. No one knows exactly what was said in the conversation that took place, but we can imagine that it was something to do with Jesus Christ spreading the news of God's plan of salvation for all! Jesus' life and teachings completed everything that was promised in the Law and the Prophets. This was confirmed by God the Father speaking to everyone there: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; LISTEN TO HIM."

God himself has told us to LISTEN TO HIM. Do you? Always? Sometimes?

Try this week to make it "always"!
