





Dear Friends,

The summer months are now upon us and we are coming to the end of our Fiscal Year on July 1st. I am very grateful for the wonderful faith and social outreach so evident by our parishioners. As we celebrate 100 years since our establishment as a Parish, we have much to be thankful for as a community. We also, though, have challenges that must be addressed. Unfortunately, we have not met our budgeted monetary goals for our Weekly Collection and even more significantly our 2018-19 Grand Annual. Our year to date Weekly Collection, budgeted at \$440,000, has raised \$414,000 (94%); while our Grand Annual Appeal, budgeted at \$300,000, has only brought in approximately \$238,000 (79%). At this point, we are looking at an \$88,000 income loss to budgeted expenses for this Fiscal Year.

I ask all parishioners to do what you can to financially support our Parish. As we face diminished attendance during the summer vacation season, our collections tend to suffer even more. Expenses, though, do not cease. I appreciate the generosity of many and the great help of those who use online giving, even while away. May we all join in promoting our Parish's well-being in its mission and ministries by our prayers, worship and sacrificial-giving.

## Tabgha, Israel

Did you know...that Jesus fed more than 5,000 people in today's Gospel? The author just mentioned the number of men present—5,000. Tradition says that there were many women and children there as well, and just as hungry as the men!

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, also known as Corpus Christi. We give thanks for the gift Jesus keeps giving us—his body and his blood—which becomes our Eucharist.

I just returned from a Pilgrimage to the Holy

Land, and I was blessed to have been able to visit the Church of the Multiplication, the traditional site of the Gospel story. We are not sure that this is the exact place, but the




number of people who have visited this area since 350 CE (Common Era) to remember this story are in the millions!

The people who had spent hours listening to Jesus' teachings were hungry. Jesus fed them, blessing five little loaves of bread and two fish. Miraculously, everyone was fed, and twelve baskets were leftover, representing the twelve tribes of Israel. Jesus wants the Jews to know that he is there to feed them, always.

If you look closely at the photo, there are only four loaves of bread in the basket. The fifth one is on the altar, as our Eucharist. The fifth one is on all of our altars, every Sunday.
