






THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

We believe in one God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The reality that God is three distinct Persons yet One is something that is difficult for the mind to grasp. But, understanding God in this way is not impossible for the contemplative heart. We need only to look around us to see our triune God playing and interplaying with all of creation with each of His Persons manifesting itself. God our Father abounds in and through creation. God the Son beats in every human heart, in love, in tenderness of mercy, and in our neighbor. God the Holy Spirit breathes life into all things and guides the course of time and the seasons, bringing wisdom and guidance to all things. Breathe in the height and depth of God's triune presence and may your heart contemplate His presence and glory.

GRADES 1-6

Did you know...that we begin and end each Liturgical moment with the prayer that acknowledges the Holy Trinity? You may know it as the Sign of the Cross. We start and end every Mass, every Baptism, every Reconciliation - every Sacrament and every prayer—with all of us forming a cross over our bodies, and praying "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen"

When we make the Sign of the Cross, we are doing many things. One is that we are calling down the presence of God in all three persons—God the Father, the creator; God the Son, the savior, and God the



Holy Spirit, the helper. We sometimes bless ourselves to ask for protection, or to ask for help. Many people bless themselves when they start traveling in a car, or take off on an airplane.

We are also reminding ourselves of our Baptism, especially when we dip our fingers in holy water before we enter or as we leave a church. We are to remember that we are all called to serve the Holy Trinity in all that we do. When we pray, we are communicating through all three persons of God. By the help of God the Holy Spirit, we speak to God the Son, who in turn speaks to God the Father. Our one God listens to every prayer we have. God's one prayer for us: that we trust God's answer.

Life is all about God's Will, not yours or mine!
