




## GOSPEL MEDITATION PENTECOST SUNDAY

"God is always more." Have you ever heard that? If we truly believe that He is infinite, then this statement is worth exploring.

Today, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit in power upon the early Church. But Pentecost wasn't the first time the disciples received the Holy Spirit. The Gospel actually occurs chronologically before Pentecost. Soon after the Resurrection, Jesus already "came and stood in their [the disciples'] midst... he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit.'"

God is always more. Sometimes we might think the grace of God as one and done. God might break through in people's lives, but it's a one-time event on a retreat or preceding a dramatic conversion of life. But there's always more to come. Even today's Gospel isn't the first time the breath of God stirred. In Genesis, it's God's breath that stirs life into Adam in the garden. Jesus breathes on the Apostles, giving them the Holy Spirit in the quiet and silence. Later, that breath will stir into a "driving wind", and the Spirit will descend with flame? not unlike Moses on Mount Sinai.

God is always more. He has spoken throughout salvation history, and continues to speak into our lives through His Church and through the Holy Spirit alive in our hearts. This Pentecost Sunday, let us come before Him with expectant hearts! Like the disciples in the Gospel and first reading, let us await what "more" God will do.

ENVIRONMENTAL MOMENT: Martin Dermady, a St Julia's parishioner from Lincoln, will join ministry staff people from faith communities and secular groups who are working to maintain a healthy environment for future generations on Saturday June 15th at St Anne's in the Fields Episcopal Church in Lincoln. 

Did you know...that the Holy Spirit that the Apostles received on Pentecost is the same Holy Spirit that we receive at Baptism? Jesus called



this gift to us an "Advocate", which means "helper". The Holy Spirit helps us with many things: He helps us to understand the teachings of Jesus; He helps us to make wise decisions; He helps us to forgive, to serve, to love unconditionally. All we need to do is ask the Holy Spirit to help us. God the Holy Spirit is the person who connects us to God the Father and God the Son, enabling us to communicate with the Father and the Son, and to hear the answers from the Father and the Son. A simple "Come, Holy Spirit" is all you need to say. Then listen with your heart, remembering how in the Gospels Jesus loved, and how the Apostles taught us to love like Jesus. God the Holy Spirit will help you find the best way to love. The correct answer will always glorify God. The correct answer isn't always the one we want to hear, but it is always the one God knows is best.

Just pray "Come, Holy Spirit".



#### ST JULIA'S PARISH AND CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

Your generosity in providing much needed items for our parish immersion trip to the Dominican republic is greatly appreciated. Throughout the month of the Sneaker Drive provides disadvantaged children and teens in Dorchester and Mattapan the chance to look and feel their best during the summer months. Of course our Parish St Vincent de Paul reaches local families and individuals who may need assistance.

These efforts are part of our Church's developing tradition that: "brings together what is and what ought to be".

We should never be afraid of identifying social injustices and working to correct and overturn them. Charity attempts to address injustice but the parish benefits most from this immersion experience by keeping in mind the 4 key principles of Catholic Social Teaching:

- 1) The principle of human dignity:
  A just society can become a reality only
  when it is based on respect of the
  transcendent dignity of the human person.
- 2) The principle of the Common Good: the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily.
- 3.) The principle of subsidiarity:
  The principle of subsidiarity protects people
  from abuses by higher-level social authority
  and calls on these same authorities to help
  individuals and intermediate groups (for
  example, families)
- 4) The principle of solidarity: Solidarity highlights in a particular way the intrinsic social nature of the human person, the equality of all in dignity and rights and the common path of individuals and peoples towards an ever more committed unity.

We don't give because we're better than others, we give because we are connected to others in the Body Of Christ.
