GRAND ANNUAL APPEAL

Our Parish needs your help and financial support. Our Catholic faith is largely lived on the local level of the parish community and your contributions provide our parish's only source of income. Saint Julia Parish strives to accomplish our ongoing mission of evangelization with sacramental ministries, faith formation, works of charity and service. This past year the parish has embraced some new outreach ventures and enhanced other existing ministries. We have teamed with *Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos* (NPH) to transform children's lives in Central and South America and the Caribbean so that they can become productive and self-sufficient members of their communities. We have continued to provide assistance to refugee families seeking legal asylum. Through the efforts of our Faith Formation team we purchased, packaged and delivered some 10,000 simple dried meals for the impoverished population of Burkino Faso, West Africa. Our commitment to the needy in our midst continues through our ministries at Bristol Lodge, Pine Street Inn and contributions to the work of the Saint Vincent de Paul Society and Food Pantry.

Our ministries, parish facilities and charitable outreach depend upon your generosity. The parish's ongoing expenses for maintenance, utilities, salaries, educational and evangelical endeavors are presently not being met by parish collections. The 2019 Fiscal Year ended positively only due to an unexpected bequest of \$60,000 from a parishioner's will. Please help our parish maintain financial stability by generously supporting our Saint Julia Parish Grand Annual Appeal. Our Budgeted Goal of \$300,000 can only be met if all parishioners participate in some way. We request prayerfully considering a contribution or pledge of \$750.00 with the hope that those who can give more will respond even more generously.

Immersion Trip to NPH Dominican Republic with St. Julia's Parish April 18 - 24, 2020

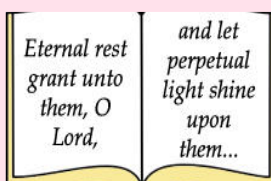
We will have the unique opportunity to stay at the NPH home and this will allow us to immerse ourselves in NPH life with the children and their culture. While the children are in school, you will help with the daily chores around the property, such as; working in the gardens and farm, caring for the special needs children, working in the kitchen and carpentry shop, and other jobs the home assigns. After a morning of work, relax and hang out with the pequeños in the afternoons. Activities will be coordinated with the children of different age groups throughout the week. Additionally, you will have the opportunity to meet with the leadership of the NPH home, tour all of the home's facilities, and hear from the children about living at NPH.

Note: A NPH USA chaperone will lead and oversee all travelers throughout the duration of the trip. All chaperones are background checked experienced volunteers.
