For thus says the LORD: Lo, I will spread prosperity over Jerusalem like a river, and the wealth of the nations like an overflowing torrent. Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

[At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said to them, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way. Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' If a peaceful person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment. Do not move about from one house to another. Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.'] Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.' Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand. I tell you, it will be more tolerable for Sodom on that day than for that town."

The seventy-two returned rejoicing, and said, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of your name." Jesus said, "I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky. Behold, I have given you the power to 'tread upon serpents' and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."

What's that???



These **Baptism Fonts** are where people who wish to become a member of the Roman Catholic Church, and have never been baptized before, receive the Sacrament of Baptism. The Font on the left is located in our St. Joseph Church, and the Font on the right is located in our St. Julia Church.

There is a Baptismal Font in every Catholic Church, but they can come in many sizes and shapes. I have



seen small ones, about the size of a basketball. I have seen large ones, that several people could take a bath in. In the days of Jesus, people were baptized in a river, usually the Jordan River. The requirement was that it was "living water" - it had to be running water. (This was probably to guarantee it was clean!) Some ancient churches had a Baptismal Font that had water from a Spring or a fountain, that would cause the water to continue to flow. Sometimes people were fully immersed in the water, and sometimes people just stood or knelt in the water, as water was poured over them.

Archeological digs have discovered Fonts dating back to the Fourth Century. Some have the shape of a Cross. Some have eight sides (the Eighth Day alluding to the Day of the Resurrection). All were used to bring people of all ages into the Roman Catholic Church, with the use of water, and the words "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit". Amen!
