History

In 1954, a young boy named Carlos was arrested trying to steal money for food from a collection box at a church in Cuernavaca, Mexico. Carlos was arrested and due to receive a harsh sentence for his crime. The priest of the church, Father William B. Wasson, asked the court to show mercy by giving him custody of Carlos so that he could feed, clothe, and provide a home for the boy. The judge accepted and continued to refer troubled boys into the care of Father Wasson. By the end of the year, 32 boys were under his care and Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH) was born.

Our Mission

Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH) means "Our Little Brothers and Sisters" in Spanish. NPH USA transforms the lives of vulnerable children in Bolivia, the Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, and Peru. Together, we help children overcome poverty and become productive, caring leaders in their own communities. Founded in 1954 by Father William Wasson, NPH is supporting nearly 7,000 children, both inside and outside our homes, ensuring they have a safe and nurturing place to live, an education, clothing, healthcare, and a strong family support system. In addition, NPH's St. Damien Pediatric Hospital employs more than 500 Haitians and is the only hospital wholly dedicated to pediatric and prenatal care in Haiti, a country of 11.5 million people.

SECURITY

Physical insecurity and food insecurity are rampant in Latin America and the Caribbean. Hunger, violence, and abandonment destabilize children and leave them to fend for themselves with no hope. NPH gives children a safe, nurturing place to thrive by providing food, residential care, health care, and education.



EDUCATION

Education is key to breaking the cycle of poverty and yet an estimated 71 million children in Latin America and the Caribbean are denied access to education. NPH helped thousands of vulnerable children and youth achieve their potentials by providing high-quality education from pre-K through university.









MEDICINE AND HEALTH

Vulnerable people living in Latin America and the Caribbean do not have access to health care due to an extreme shortage of healthcare providers or because of poverty. NPH gives children and families access to affordable, high-quality health care.

With medical clinics in NPH homes, plus a premier 224-bed pediatric hospital in Haiti which includes emergency and pediatric intensive care units, and a cancer center, NPH saves lives and provides treatment and quality of life to high-risk children.





SPECIAL NEEDS

Children with disabilities are stigmatized in Latin America and the Caribbean, resulting in restricted access to education and health care. The effects of being deprived of care, therapy, and dignity are devastating and long-lasting.

NPH enhances the quality of life for children and adults with special needs by providing access to education and specialized treatment, and the opportunity to lead a dignified life.





SUSTAINABILITY

Poverty and extreme weather threaten access to clean water and nutritious food in Latin America and the Caribbean. NPH is creating environmentally sustainable homes that provide eco-friendly and cost-effective solutions to help promote self-sufficiency and offset skyrocketing costs.



WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT, LIFE SKILLS, & GIRLS' EMPOWERMENT

Major regional crises negatively affect the jobs market, often leaving the lowest-skilled workers unemployed, further worsening inequality and the wage gap. NPH provides local people with employment, and children and youth with training, education, life skills, and character development to acquire employment and be productive, caring role models in their communities.
