He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name."

Responsorial Psalm: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad."


Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Wonderful food, wonderful music, and a wonderful community! Many thanks to all who assisted in making this a special occasion!








The Holy Spirit in the Bible


