First Reading: **1 Kings 3:5, 7-12**

The LORD appeared to Solomon in a dream at night. God said, "Ask something of me and I will give it to you." Solomon answered: "O LORD, my God, you have made me, your servant, king to succeed my father David; but I am a mere youth, not knowing at all how to act. I serve you in the midst of the people whom you have chosen, a people so vast that it cannot be numbered or counted. Give your servant, therefore, an understanding heart to judge your people and to distinguish right from wrong. For who is able to govern this vast people of yours?" The LORD was pleased that Solomon made this request. So God said to him: "Because you have asked for this— not for a long life for yourself, nor for riches, nor for the life of your enemies, but for understanding so that you may know what is right— I do as you requested. I give you a heart so wise and understanding that there has never been anyone like you up to now, and after you there will come no one to equal you."

Gospel: **Matthew 13:44-52 OR 13:44-46**

(Jesus said to his disciples: "The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field, which a person finds and hides again, and out of joy goes and sells all that he has and buys that field. Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant searching for fine pearls. When he finds a pearl of great price, he goes and sells all that he has and buys it.) Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net thrown into the sea, which collects fish of every kind. When it is full they haul it ashore and sit down to put what is good into buckets. What is bad they throw away. Thus it will be at the end of the age. The angels will go out and separate the wicked from the righteous and throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth. "Do you understand all these things?" They answered, "Yes." And he replied, "Then every scribe who has been instructed in the kingdom of heaven is like the head of a household who brings from his storeroom both the new and the old."

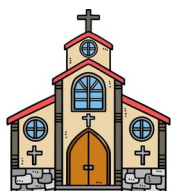

Man's Response to God
The Obedience of Faith

By his Revelation, the invisible God, from the fullness of his love, addresses men as his friends, and moves among them, in order to invite and receive them into his own company. The adequate response to this invitation is faith. By faith, man completely submits his intellect and his will to God. With his whole being man gives his assent to God the revealer. Sacred Scripture calls this human response to God, the author of revelation, "the obedience of faith." Faith is a personal adherence of the whole man to God who reveals himself. It involves an assent of the intellect and will to the self-revelation God has made through his deeds and words. "To believe" has thus a twofold reference: to the person and to the truth: to the truth, by trust in the person who bears witness to it. We must believe in no one but God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Faith is a supernatural gift from God. In order to believe, man needs the interior helps of the Holy Spirit. "Believing" is a human act, conscious and free, corresponding to the dignity of the human person. "Believing" is an ecclesial act. The Church's faith precedes, engenders, supports, and nourishes our faith. The Church is the mother of all believers. No one can have God as Father who does not have the Church as Mother. We believe all that which is contained in the word of God, written or handed down, and which the Church proposes for belief as divinely revealed. Faith is necessary for salvation. The Lord himself affirms: "He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned" (Mk16:16). Faith is a foretaste of the knowledge that will make us blessed in the life to come.

5 Things to Know about Blessed Stanley Rother

1. Blessed Stanley Rother is the first American-born martyr.
2. Though he struggled academically in the seminary, he was able to learn the local native language in Guatemala, the Tz'utujil language. He translated the New Testament and the missal prayers for Mass into the Tz'utujil language.
3. Blessed Stanley was a handyman and a jack of all trades. He used these skills to build many buildings and help the people with their farming skills.
4. Blessed Stanley Rother returned from Oklahoma to his Guatemalan parish despite the danger to his own life, saying, "A shepherd cannot run from his flock."
5. Blessed Stanley Rother's Tz'utujil parishioners have his heart. His body was returned to Oklahoma for burial, but his Guatemalan parishioners enshrined his heart. The room in which he was killed is now a chapel.
